## **Interview Questions: Lawful and Unlawful Inquiries**

The New York State Human Rights Law probihits discrimination in employment because of age, race, creed, color, national origin, sex, disability, marital status or criminal record gender, gender expression. Courts have the view as discriminating questions attempting to garner information on these topics which do not directly pertain to bona fide occupational qualifications (BFOQs). It is unlawful to ask questions whose answers will indirectly reveal information as to race, creed, color, national origin, sex, marital status, disability, age, or arrest record gender, gender expression in cases where such information may not be asked directly.

References		Require the submission of a religious reference.  Questions to references which elicit information specifying applicant's race, color, religion, ancestry, age, marital status, national origin, or sexual orientation.

"Have you ever collected workers' compensation or temporary disability insurance for a previous illnes or injury?"  "Questions regarding applicant's general state of health or medical condition.
Marital Status	☑ Only if required as a bona fide occupational qualification (BFOQ).	Whether single, married, divorce, widowed, separated, etc.  Mr., Mrs., Miss, or Ms.  Names and ages of spouse and children; provisions for child care.  Spouse's place of employment.  With whom do you reside?" "Do you live with your parents?"
Miscellaneous	✓ Notice to applicants that any misstatements or omission of material facts in the application may be cause for dismissal.	Require an applicant to submit a resume containing answers to unlawful inquiries.
